Overview

Wiring two outlets in one box is most safely achieved through parallel pigtail, where the incoming power is split into multiple leads before reaching the individual receptacles. Pigtails act as bridges, allowing you to connect several wires to a single point without overloading connections. Wiring for multiple ground fault circuit interrupters (gfc) and standard duplex receptacles are included with protected and non-protected arrangements.
