

AP using a PoE switch

A PoE switch powers your access point via Ethernet while providing network connectivity, allowing you to deploy APs without separate power adapters. Understanding PoE Basics A PoE switch acts as Power Sourcing Equipment (PSE), supplying electrical power over Ethernet cables to the Powered Device (PD), which is your AP. PoE standards include 802.3af (PoE), 802.3at (PoE+), and 802.3bt (PoE++), each delivering different wattages. Ensure your switch supports the required PoE standard for your AP and that the total available power can support all connected devices. Physical Setup Cabling: Use shielded Cat5e or higher Ethernet cables for outdoor or long-distance connections. For outdoor APs, ensure cables are grounded to prevent ESD damage. Connection: Plug the AP's main Ethernet port into a PoE-enabled port on the switch. This single cable provides both power and network connectivity. Mounting: Follow manufacturer guidelines for mounting height and orientation. For example, Ubiquiti APs should be mounted at least 60 cm from edges and with the cable feed pointing downward. Optional Fiber Backhaul: For high-speed or long-distance deployments, you can connect the PoE switch to a fiber uplink using SFP modules. Configuration Switch Configuration: Verify PoE is enabled on the port connected to the AP. On Cisco switches, commands like `show power inline` display available power and active PoE devices. AP Configuration: Access the AP's management interface via web browser or controller software. Assign IP addresses, SSIDs, and security settings. Power Negotiation: The AP and switch negotiate power class automatically. Ensure the AP's power requirement does not exceed the port's capacity. Special Cases: For older switches or pre-standard PoE devices, you may need to enable inline power or pre-standard PoE settings to prevent overloads. Testing and Troubleshooting Confirm the AP powers on and connects to the network. Check the switch's PoE status to ensure the correct wattage is delivered. If...
