- Turn Off the Breaker:** Switch off the tripped breaker before inspecting the circuit.
- Unplug All Devices:** Disconnect all appliances and devices on the affected circuit to isolate the problem.
- Reset the Breaker:** Turn the breaker back on. If it stays on, plug in devices one at a time, observing if the breaker trips again. This helps identify a faulty appliance.
