Rung spacing: For ladder trays, 6 to 9 inches between rungs is preferred to maintain cable support and prevent sagging. Load considerations: Hangers should support the weight of the tray plus cables, including allowances for short-circuit forces and environmental loads like wind or ice. Practical Guidelines Ensure the hanger depth allows adequate clearance for cable bending and maintenance access. Use code-compliant materials and fasteners to meet NEC, NEMA, IEC, or BS EN 61537 standards. For heavy or high-density installations, consider increasing hanger depth or using additional supports to prevent tray deflection and maintain structural integrity. By selecting the correct hanger depth and spacing, you ensure safe, code-compliant, and durable cable tray installations that accommodate current and future cable loads.
