- Center suspensions:** For long spans to prevent sagging.

Supports should be spaced according to the tray type and load, typically every 1.5–3 meters for ladder trays, and closer for heavier loads. All mounting elements must be corrosion-resistant, such as galvanized steel or stainless steel, to withstand outdoor conditions.

Installation Guidelines

- Route planning:** Mark horizontal and vertical runs, avoiding clashes with other services and maintaining access for maintenance.
- Clearances:** Maintain at least 12 inches of vertical clearance above trays for installation and maintenance access, and ensure separation between high-power and low-power cables to prevent EMI.
- Environmental protection:** Use trays with anti-corrosion coatings or materials suitable for outdoor exposure, and consider covers for sensitive cables.
- Cable fill limits:** Do not exceed 40% of the tray cross-section for power cables and 50% for control cables to prevent overheating.
- Grounding:** Metallic trays can serve as equip...
