Additional Tips Strain Relief: Provide strain relief at entry and exit points to protect terminations. Labeling: Use markers to identify cables for easier maintenance. Compliance: Ensure all installations meet NEC 392 requirements for vertical cable trays, including bonding and grounding if the tray serves as an equipment grounding conductor. By following these steps, cables can be safely and efficiently installed in vertical cable trays, minimizing the risk of damage, overheating, and code violations.
