The Tsubasa Bridge, also known as the Neak Loeung Bridge, features striking white “wing” structures and spans the Mekong River, symbolizing Cambodia's connectivity and development.

Overview and Location The Tsubasa Bridge (ប្រាសាទប្រាសាទ) crosses the Mekong River at Neak Loeung, linking Kandal Province on the west with Prey Veng Province on the east along National Road 1, the main artery connecting Phnom Penh to Vietnam . It was inaugurated in April 2015 and stretches 2,215 meters, making it one of Cambodia's largest modern bridges .

Design and “Wing” Feature The bridge is renowned for its brilliant white wing-like structures, which are both aesthetic and symbolic. These wings represent freedom, progress, and the ability for Cambodia's economy and people to “fly”, reflecting the bridge's role in unifying the nation and facilitating trade and travel . The design combines modern engineering with symbolic architecture, making it a landmark visible from the riverside parks during early morning or late afternoon .

Construction and Engineering The Tsubasa Bridge was a Japanese-funded project under the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), emphasizing high-quality infrastructure . The construction overcame significant challenges, including riverbank erosion, seasonal water fluctuations of 7.5 meters, and the presence of land mines and unexploded ordnance from past conflicts . The project required approximately 8 million man-ho...
