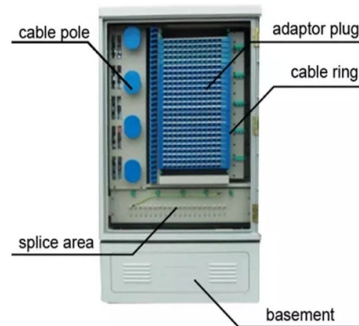


Can BV cables be run in cable trays

It is not permissible to run BV cables in cable trays; only tray-rated or armored cables are allowed.
