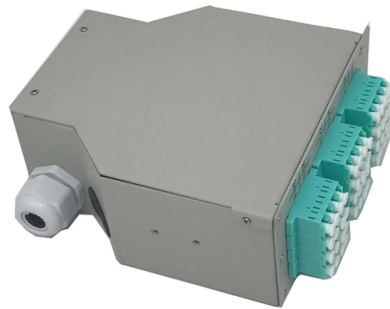

Insulation and Phase Coding: Outgoing cables must maintain phase sequence RYB and use PVC insulating sleeves or colored insulation for safety.

Clearances: Adequate spacing between busbars and cables is required to prevent overheating and ensure compliance with electrical safety standards.

Protection Rating: Boxes should meet IP-55 for outdoor use, ensuring dust and water resistance.

Earthing: Solid earthing points are provided on either side of the box for grounding.
