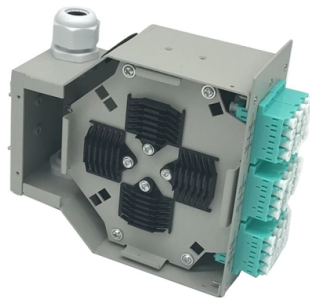


Configuration of a 24-Port Fiber Optic Switch

Create VLANs: Define VLANs to segment network traffic. Assign fiber ports to the appropriate VLANs to ensure proper traffic separation and security.
Trunking (Optional): If connecting to other switches, configure trunk ports to carry multiple VLANs across fiber links.
