A reserved opening in a cable tray is a designated space that allows cables to exit, branch, or connect to equipment safely while maintaining NEC compliance. Purpose of Reserved Openings Reserved openings are used to: Allow cables to exit the tray toward equipment or devices without sharp bends. Facilitate branching from the main tray to secondary trays or conduits. Maintain proper spacing and bend radius to prevent cable damage and ensure signal integrity. Ensure accessibility for maintenance and future cable additions, in line with NEC Article 392 requirements.

Design Considerations

- Location and Size:** The opening should be positioned where cables need to exit or branch, and its size must accommodate the number and type of cables while respecting the tray's fill limits (40% for power cables, 50% for control cables).
- Bend Radius:** Maintain the minimum bend radius for cables as they exit the tray to prevent insulation damage and signal degradation.
- Connection Brackets:** Use appropriate connecting brackets or fittings to secure the tray at the opening. These brackets can vary in design depending on whether the tray is aluminum, steel, or mesh, and whether it is ventilated or solid.
- Grounding:** For metallic trays, ensure that the tray and any connecting brackets maintain proper grounding continuity if the tray serves as an equipment grounding conductor.
- Accessibility:** Openings should remain accessible for inspection, maintenance, and future cable routing, avoiding enclosed or hoistway areas.

Installation Tips

- Mesh or ventilated trays allow easier creation of openings by separating wires or cutting sections to form exits.
- Solid-bottom trays may require pre-fabricated knockouts or cutouts to create reserved openings safely.

Fastening: Secure cables at the exit point using clamps or ties to prevent movement and mechanical stress.
