

Construction of fiber optic cable lines in Afghanistan



AI Overview

Afghanistan is actively expanding its fiber optic network, deploying thousands of kilometers of cables to enhance national and regional connectivity. Overview of Fiber Optic Infrastructure Afghanistan has been developing its fiber optic network to modernize telecommunications and connect all 34 provinces. The country has already laid over 4,000 kilometers of fiber optic cables, linking major cities such as Kabul, Herat, Mazar-i-Sharif, Kandahar, and Jalalabad, and establishing cross-border connections with Iran, Pakistan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan, and Tajikistan. The Afghanistan National Ring Network serves as a backbone encircling the country, facilitating both domestic and international data traffic. Key Projects and Expansion Recent initiatives include a 488-kilometer expansion project approved by the Ministry of Communications and Information Technology, aimed at extending the network to additional provinces. Over the past three years, more than 1,800 kilometers of fiber optic network have been expanded, with ongoing operations in multiple provinces. The Afghan Fiber Optic Ring, part of the broader Digital Silk Road, is designed to improve regional connectivity and support the knowledge economy in Central, South, and Southwest Asia. Technical Deployment Fiber optic construction in Afghanistan uses a combination of aerial, underground, and specialized routes to adapt to diverse terrains. Key technologies include: Aerial ADSS (All-Dielectric Self-Supporting) cables for co-location with power lines, resistant to UV and extreme temperatures. Armored GYTA53 underground cables with anti-rodent PE sheaths for rocky or flood-prone areas. OPGW (Optical Ground Wire) for high-altitude power transmission towers, combining lightning protection with data transmission. Air-blown micro-cable technology enabling rapid deployment at speeds of up to 80 km/...
