- Scalability:** They support a large number of connections and can adapt to growing network demands.
- Redundancy:** Many core switches include redundant power supplies and links to ensure uninterrupted operation.
- Centralized Management:** They provide a single point for managing network traffic, security policies, and monitoring.
- Optimized Architecture:** Core switches use specialized hardware like ASICs for fast packet switching, avoiding resource-heavy tasks such as deep packet inspection.

- Dedicated vs. Collapsed Core:** In smaller networks, a high-performance distribution switch can serve as a collapsed core, performing both core and distribution functions.
- Network Size:** Networks with fewer than 50 devices typically do not require a dedicated core switch, while networks exceeding 150 devices benefit from a dedicated core to prevent bottlenecks.
