Circuit Diagram Marking

Single-Line Diagram: Represent the DB schematically with lines showing connections from the main supply to the main MCB, then to RCCB, and finally to branch MCBs.

Numbering Scheme: Assign an Electrical Identification Number to the DB (e.g., SWB-01). Prefix each circuit with the DB ID and a sequential number (e.g., SWB-01-C1 for the first circuit). In multi-bus systems, label circuits according to bus sections (A/B) and ascending order of importance: incomers, transformer feeders, and plant loads.

Labeling on Equipment:

- Main MCB:** "MAIN 230V DB – SWB-01"
- RCCB:** Include rating and DB reference
- Branch MCBs:** Label with specific load or area (e.g., "Kitchen Outlets East Wall").

Use durable labels or a label maker; avoid masking tape.

Safety and Verification: Maintain an up-to-date single-line diagram near the DB for quick isolation and maintenance. Test each circuit with a circuit finder or voltage tester to confirm labeling accuracy. Ensure labels are legible and resistant to fading or smudging.

Best Practices

- Start numbering from the main incomer and proceed sequentially through branch circuits.
- Include circuit type, load description, and brea...
