

Electrical distribution box height setting

Distribution boxes should generally be installed 1.3 to 1.8 meters above the ground, with dimensions tailored to the number and size of switches and incoming wires for safe and accessible operation.

Installation Height

Ground-mounted boxes: The bottom edge should be raised 2 to 4 inches to prevent moisture damage, and the vertical distance from the ground should generally be 1.3 to 1.5 meters for ergonomic operation.

Consistency: Within the same building, installation heights should be uniform, with allowable deviations within 10 millimeters for aesthetic and operational consistency.

Dimension Requirements

Small residential boxes (lighting circuits or small power loads):

- Width:** Sum of switch widths + 20 mm on each side
- Height:** Switch height + 40 mm
- Depth:** Maximum switch depth + 10 mm

Larger boxes (more than 20 switches or power distribution):

- Consider two rows of switches**
- Width:** Sum of switch widths + 40 mm
- Height:** Switch height + 40 mm
- Depth:** Maximum switch depth + 10 mm

Allow extra space for bending radius of incoming wires >10 mm² and terminal connections

Placement and Safety Considerations

Install in dry, well-ventilated, and accessible areas to prevent overheating and facilitate maintenance. Avoid locations with corrosive gases, liquids, strong vibrations, or impact hazards. Maintain sufficient clearance around the box for at least two people to work simultaneously and for emergency access. Ensure grounding of the metal enclosure and internal components, and include protective devices like breakers, fuses, and surge protectors. Keep the distance between the distribution box and controlled equipment...
