- Fusion Splicer or Mechanical Splice Tools:** Used to join two fiber strands permanently or temporarily, ensuring minimal signal loss ().
- Cleaver and Cleaning Tools:** A cleaver precisely cuts fiber ends, while specialized cleaning tools remove dust or debris from connectors and ports to prevent signal degradation ().
- Safety Equipment:** Gloves and safety glasses protect against tiny glass shards during handling ().

Connection Process

- Install the ONT:** Connect the fiber optic cable from the wall outlet to the ONT's designated port and power it on. Wait for status lights to stabilize ().
- Connect ONT to Router:** Use an Ethernet cable to link the ONT's LAN port to the router's WAN port. Power on the router and confirm connectivity ().
- Splicing or Termination:** If extending or repairing fiber, use a fusion splicer or mechanical splice to join fibers. Ensure proper alignment and minimal bending to avoid signal loss ().
- Testing and Optimization:** After connection, test the fiber link for speed and signal integrity. Optimize router placem...
