Use a figure-8 pattern when laying cable from reels to prevent kinks and mechanical stress. Maintain minimum bend radius as specified in the cable datasheet; exceeding it can cause unseen fiber damage. Clamp vertical installations at intervals to prevent excessive tension and movement. Keep cables clean and away from metallic power lines to avoid interference and physical damage.

Connector and End-Face Care Clean connectors and transceivers before mating to minimize system attenuation. Use optical-grade wipes, swabs, or canned air, and avoid scrubbing motions that could grind debris into the fiber. Inspect fiber ends for scratches or contamination, as dirty connectors can cross-contaminate mating transceivers.

Testing and Verification After installation: Verify polarity by checking that Tx ports connect to Rx ports correctly. Test the link for attenuation and continuity to ensure proper signal transmission. Troubleshoot any issues using systematic methods, including cleaning, replacing damaged cables, or reconfiguring modules.
