

# Fiber optic cable routing for router

- Link ONT to Router:** Use an Ethernet cable to connect the ONT's LAN port to the router's WAN port. For advanced setups, an SFP+ module may be used for multi-gigabit connections.
- Power Sequence:** Power on the ONT first, wait for status lights to stabilize, then power on the router. This ensures proper registration with the ISP network.
- Router Configuration:** Access the router's admin panel (e.g., 192.168.1.1), enter ISP credentials if required, enable QoS for critical traffic, and update firmware for optimal performance.

- Cable Management:** Avoid sharp bends or kinks in the fiber cable; use cable clips or conduits to secure routing.
- Environmental Considerations:** Keep ONT and router away from moisture, heat sources, and direct sunlight.
