

Fiber optic cables and electrical cables run through the same conduit

Hybrid Cables: Some manufacturers offer hybrid cables that combine fiber and electrical conductors in a single assembly designed to minimize interference and heat issues.

Ownership and Maintenance: In some cases, shared conduits may only be allowed if both cables are owned and maintained by the same entity, particularly under NESC guidelines.
