- Clean Connectors:** Fiber connectors must be free of dust or debris to prevent signal loss.

- Bandwidth and Distance:** Single-mode fiber provides higher bandwidth and longer reach, suitable for inter-building connections. Multi-mode fiber is ideal for shorter distances within a building.
