- Boots:** Flexible coverings that protect the fiber and reduce stress at the connector interface. Spring-loaded designs are common, pressing the fiber faces together to eliminate air gaps and reduce signal loss.

Types of Fiber Optic Connectors There are over 100 types of fiber optic connectors, but the most widely used include:

- SC (Subscriber Connector):** Square-shaped, push-pull mechanism, commonly used in FTTH and data centers.
- LC (Lucent Connector):** Miniaturized version of SC with a 1.25mm ferrule, ideal for high-density applications.
- ST (Straight Tip):** Bayonet-style connector, often used in legacy networks.
- MTP/MPO:** Multi-fiber connectors for high-density cabling.

Connectors are categorized into single-mode and multimode types based on fiber characteristics, and their performance is measured by insertion loss and return loss.
