Overview

Acceptable dB loss for fiber depends on the component you're measuring: a single mated connector pair should lose no more than 0.75 dB, a fusion splice should stay under 0. The loss spec for prepolished/mechanical splice connectors or multifiber connectors like MPOs will be higher (0.75 max per EIA/TIA 568) When testing cable plants per OFSTP-14 (double ended).
