

Fixing Vertical Cables on Exterior Wall Cable Trays

Mounting and Supporting Vertical Cables Vertical cable runs require secure attachment to the tray and wall. According to the 18th Edition IET Wiring Regulations, metal clips should be used every 400mm for exposed vertical cables, while plastic clips may supplement but not replace metal fixings. For larger bundles, consider using metal cable containment to maintain stability and prevent sagging. When installing vertical supports: Use threaded rods, trapeze, or swing supports anchored to the wall or structural elements. Ensure cross members are level and allow horizontal adjustment for tray clips. Drill or punch holes slightly larger than the rod diameter to facilitate adjustment and prevent thread damage. Attach tray clips either inside or outside the tray, depending on rung spacing and cable routing. Cable Management and Safety Maintain proper bending radii to avoid cable damage, especially for large or stiff cables. Keep high-voltage and low-voltage cables separated by at least 300mm to prevent interference. Plan cable pulls to minimize bends and tension, using rollers or sheaves for long vertical runs. Inspect all materials for compliance with project specifications and environmental suitability b...
