High Voltage Cables High voltage (HV) cables are designed to carry electrical power at voltages ranging from 1 kV to 1000 kV. Low Voltage Cables Low voltage (LV) cables operate at below 1 kV, typically between 50V and 1000V, and are used for building wiring, household appliances, and short-distance power distribution. They are lighter, more flexible, and often use PVC or rubber insulation. LV cables are common in residential, commercial, and light industrial settings, where the electrical load is moderate and safety requirements are less stringent than for HV systems.

Fiber Optic Cables as Low Voltage Systems Fiber optic cables are classified under low-voltage cabling, but they differ fundamentally from copper-based LV cables because they transmit data using light pulses instead of electrical current. This means they do not carry electrical voltage at all, making them inherently safe from electrical hazards. Fiber optics are used for high-speed data transmission, long-distance communication, and applications requiring immunity to electromagnetic interference. They are widely deployed in telecommunications, internet networks, cable television, and industrial control systems.
