

How long should a 200mm cable tray support be cut



Overview

FRP Supports and Cable Trays can be cut at any length. For FRP FOE Cable Ladders, please follow the same guidelines as all Cable Ladders by cutting in 300 mm steps for optimal strength and performance. Drilling jigs for splice connections are available. This guide covers the critical steps, from selecting the right electrical cable tray and performing accurate cable fill calculations to managing a safe cable pull through and ensuring all bonding and grounding requirements are met. For licensed electricians, mastering these principles is essential. The NEC requires that cable trays must be supported by members at an interval specified by the cable tray manufacturer, but not more than 5 feet for horizontal runs to support the weight of the cables and other loads.
