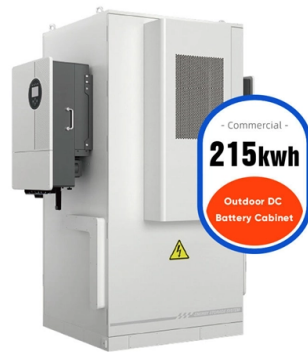


How to connect fiber optic cables and pigtails for home access

Align the bare end of the pigtail with the prepared fiber using a fusion splicer. Fuse the fibers together with an electric arc to create a continuous optical path. Apply a heat-shrink sleeve over the splice for durability and protection.

Step 4: Install the Fiber Wall Socket

Choose a dry, accessible wall location near power outlets and within 3 meters of the ONT. Cut a hole in the drywall according to the socket template and secure the back box with screws. Run the incoming fiber through the box's entry port, maintaining a minimum 30mm bend radius. Snap the pigtail connector into the socket adapter and attach the faceplate. Coil any excess fiber inside the box, leaving at least 50cm of slack for future adjustments.

Step 5: Connect to the ONT and Test

Use a patch cable (SC/APC to SC/APC) to connect the wall socket to the ONT. Test the connection using an OTDR or power meter. Acceptable GPON signal levels are typically between -8 dBm and -27 dBm. Recheck splices if the signal is below -27 dBm.
