

How to connect the fiber optic cable and the terminal box

Insert the connector into the designated port in the terminal box, ensuring it clicks securely in place. Organize and store any excess fiber in the splice tray or cable management area inside the box, maintaining the minimum bend radius to prevent signal loss.

Testing and Verification After connecting the fiber, test the connection using a fiber optic power meter or Optical Time Domain Reflectometer (OTDR) to verify signal strength and continuity. Check...
