

How to number the new optical cable identifiers

1. Use a Standardized Identifier System

3. Apply Color Coding
Color coding helps quickly identify fiber types and individual strands:
Outer jacket colors: Yellow for single-mode, orange or aqua for multimode fibers
Inner fiber sequence: Follow the 12-color repeating pattern for multi-fiber cables (Blue, Orange, Green, Brown, Slate, White, Red, Black, Yellow, Violet, Rose, Aqua)
High-count cables (>12 fibers): Use a Tube and Fiber system, where each buffer tube has a color, and fibers inside follow the 12-color sequence. For example, Fiber #34 is the 10th fiber in the 3rd tube (Green tube, Violet fiber),
Connector colors: Blue for single-mode UPC, Green for single-mode APC, Beige/Black/Aqua/Magenta for multimode
4. Follow TIA-606-B/C Standards
