

How to open a telecom server case when it has no power

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How do I unlock Dell T610 case?

I've just got a Dell PowerEdge T610 server. The case is locked and looks like it needs a flattish key to open. Two circular ended keys came with the server, but they fit the front of the case,

On the top of the case there's a little "screw" that points to a closed padlock, and can be rotated to point at the open padlock. Give it a little turn, push down, slide the cover back, then remove.
