

How to quickly install low-voltage network cables into cable trays

- 4. Securing and Supporting Cables** Fix cables at regular intervals using cable ties, clamps, or straps, ensuring they are snug but not overly tight to avoid crushing the insulation. Maintain consistent spacing between cables and rungs, typically 6 to 9 inches (150–230 mm) for ladder trays. Use markers or labels for cable identification to facilitate maintenance and troubleshooting.
