- Power Meter and Light Source** Measures insertion loss by transmitting light through the pigtail. Can use a launch cable (temporary pigtail splice) to connect to the fiber under test. Ensures the optical path is complete and identifies excessive loss.
- Visual Fault Locator (VFL)** Injects visible light to locate breaks, tight bends, or poor connections. Confirms continuity and polarity quickly.

Continuity Test Verifies the optical path is intact. A failed test indicates a broken core or misalignment.

Best Practices

- Clean connectors before testing to avoid contamination.
- Avoid tight bends or mechanical stress during installation, as micro-cracks can develop over time.
- Use proper fusion or mechanical splicing techniques for the bare fiber end of the pigtail.
- Replace defective pigtails promptly to maintain network performance.
