

If you have a fiber optic cable just plug it into the router

Step 4: Verify the Connection

Check the ONT lights: Power should be solid green, PON/Optical should be solid green or blue. Test internet access on a connected device to ensure the router is receiving the signal.

Precautions

Always turn off the router before connecting the fiber cable. Avoid bending the fiber cable beyond its minimum bend radius. Handle connectors by the plastic housing to prevent contamination or damage. Place the ONT and router in a dry, ventilated area near power outlets. Following these steps ensures a secure, high-performance fiber connection from your ISP to your router, enabling fast and reliable internet access.
