Check for Reliability: Ensure all connections are tight, clearly marked, and free from looseness. Proper grounding reduces resistance and ensures the safe operation of electrical equipment.

Additional Considerations

Use the correct wire gauge as specified by local codes (e.g., 10 AWG in the US for certain applications) to maintain low resistance and effective grounding. If the distribution box is metallic, the enclosure itself may also be bonded to the PE bar for additional safety. Regular inspection and maintenance of grounding connections are recommended to ensure long-term safety and compliance. By following these st...

Each DISTRIBUTION BOX and controller must be grounded. On the US market, a 5.26 mm² (10 AWG) ground wire must be used, and in all other markets a 6 mm² must be used.
