What “compatibility” really means?

All reputable transceivers follow the Multi-Source Agreement (MSA). MSA defines size, pin-out, power and signalling so parts from different makers can physically. The "Small Form-factor Pluggable" (SFP) footprint remains the champion of backward compatibility. While SFP+ (10G) and SFP28 (25G) used NRZ (Non-Return to Zero) modulation, SFP56 utilizes PAM4 (Pulse Amplitude Modulation 4-level). Implication: You cannot plug an SFP56 module into an SFP28 port and. SFP, SFP+, and SFP28 share the same physical size but differ in electrical performance.
