LC (Lucent Connector): Small form factor, ideal for high-density applications. MU (Miniature SC): Compact, suitable for dense setups. Connectors may have different ferrule polishes: PC (Physical Contact): Reduces air gaps, lowering loss and back reflection. APC (Angled Physical Contact): Angled ferrule end for single-mode systems sensitive to reflections. Splicing Splicing is used for permanent connections and provides lower loss than connectors. Two main types exist: Fusion Splicing: Uses an electric arc to fuse fiber ends, offering the most reliable joint, ideal for long-haul or high-performance networks. Mechanical Splicing: Aligns fibers in a sleeve with index...
