Add Labels or Flow Arrows You can specify labels, flow arrows, or both to indicate cable direction and type. This helps installers follow the intended routing and ensures clarity in complex tee configurations.

Preview and Adjust Use the preview function to verify that the line pattern and spacing are correct before finalizing the drawing. Adjust as needed to match physical installation requirements.
