Deployment and Types

OLTs are typically installed at the service provider's central office or distribution points and can support various PON standards such as EPON, GPON, XG-PON, or WDM. Each OLT port can serve multiple ONUs, with split ratios ranging from 1:32 to 1:128 depending on the technology. Modern OLTs may include modules for signal conversion, uplink interfaces, switching fabric, and control/management modules to handle complex network operations.

In summary, the OLT (or Optical Line Termination) is a critical component in fiber optic networks, enabling high-speed, reliable communication between service providers and end users while managing multiple subscriber connections efficiently.
