4. Non-Compliant Equipment Only equipment that meets relevant standards (e.g., ANSI/NFPA 70, AS/NZS 3012:2019, BS 7671:2018) is allowed. Using indoor-rated equipment outdoors, or devices not designed for temporary construction use, is prohibited.
5. Mechanical and Environmental Hazards Distribution boxes must be mechanically protected from impact, moisture, and dust. Items that compromise the IP rating or allow water ingress are prohibited. Boxes should not be placed where they can be struck by vehicles, cranes, or heavy machinery without additional protection.
6. Unauthorized Access Only qualified personnel may access energized boxes. Allowing untrained workers to open or tamper with distribution boxes is prohibited due to th...
