Network redundancy provides multiple paths for traffic so that network communications remain functional even during a failure. A network failure can occur due to a faulty device/link or a network attack (e., DDoS, man-in-the-middle attacks, ARP spoofing, etc. If your 6500 core switches are up to date with Sup-720-VS or Sup-2T, you could convert them to VSS.
