BS 5266-1:2025 refers to BS EN 1838:2024 for lighting performance and states minimum requirements: Escape routes: ≥ 1 lx across the whole route width. For routes > 2 m, exclude 0. This makes it easier and faster to leave an endangered building, which directly translates into the protection of the health and life of the occupants. Buildings - both residential and public.
