

Requirements for a three-level distribution box

A three-level distribution box system requires hierarchical wiring, separate circuits for power and lighting, proper spacing, environmental safety, and individual protection for each device.

Hierarchical Structure A three-level distribution system consists of primary, secondary, and tertiary distribution boxes. The primary distribution box receives power from the transformer and distributes it to secondary boxes. The secondary distribution box routes power to specific buildings, floors, or zones. The tertiary distribution box is the final junction point for individual equipment or household systems, delivering power to end-use devices. Each level must follow the principle of no cross-level bypassing, ensuring proper hierarchical branching.

Circuit Protection Each distribution box should include circuit breakers, residual current devices (RCDs), and fuses. The principle of “one machine, one switch, one leakage, one box, one lock” must be followed, meaning a single switchgear should not control multiple devices or outlets. Tertiary boxes should have the final leakage protection switch for each appliance.

Separation of Circuits Power and lighting circuits should be separated, even if combined in the same distribution board. Switch boxes for power and lighting must be installed separately, with no shared enclosures. This ensures safety and prevents interference between circuits.

Spacing and Layout The main distribution board should be near the power source. Distribution boards should be located close to concentrated loads. The distance between a distribution board and a switch box should not exceed 30 meters, and the horizontal distance between a switch box and its controlled equipment should preferably not exceed 3 meters.
