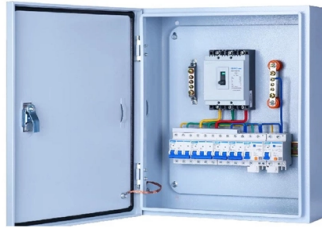


Requirements for cable tray support arms



AI Overview

Material and Construction

Support arms are typically made from steel or stainless steel, with galvanization or other coatings to improve corrosion resistance. They must be compatible with the cable tray system and capable of supporting the tray without deformation. For fire-rated installations, materials must meet the relevant fire-resistance classifications.

Dimensions and Load Capacity

- Tray widths: Commonly 100–300 mm for RS 60 systems.
- Rail height: 60 mm for standard RS 60 trays.
- Support arm lengths: Pendant brackets up to 900–1500 mm; cantilever brackets for wall or ceiling mounting vary from 100–300 mm.
- Fastening: Typically two mushroom head bolts per tray connection; threaded rods (M10) may be used for ceiling suspension.
- Spacing: Horizontal and vertical changes of direction must be supported within 150 mm of joints.
- Maximum permissible cable dead weight and fastening spacing are defined by the standard and must be adhered to for safety.
