- Load Capacity:** Supports must be engineered to carry the combined weight of the cable tray and cables, including any additional loads from wind, snow, or maintenance activities. The system should distribute weight evenly across all supports.
- Material and Corrosion Protection:** Supports are typically made from galvanized steel, stainless steel, or aluminum, with corrosion-resistant coatings suitable for rooftop exposure. Material selection should consider environmental conditions such as UV exposure, rain, and temperature fluctuations.
- Custom Designs:** For complex rooftop layouts or heavy cabling, custom support designs may be necessary to ensure stability and compliance with structural requirements.
- Standards Compliance:** Cable tray supports should comply with BS EN 61537 or equivalent standards, ensuring safe installation and mechanical performance under imposed loads, including wind, ice, and snow.
