Always power on the ONT before the router to allow it to establish a connection with the ISP's network. Place both devices in a dry, well-ventilated area near a surge-protected electrical outlet. Configuration and Troubleshooting. Log into your router's admin panel to verify WAN settings, VLAN, DHCP, or PPPoE configurations if required by your ISP. Restart both the ONT and router to resolve temporary glitches. Check indicator lights on the ONT and router; a "LOS" (Loss of Signal) LED on the ONT indicates a fiber connectivity issue.
