5. Environmental Considerations Evaluate temperature range, vibration, and humidity tolerance. For industrial or outdoor installations, select relays with robust enclosures and high IP ratings.
6. Connectivity and Cable Length Standard cable lengths and connection types should match your system requirements. Some safety switches support passive taps or GuardLink integration for monitoring and control ().
