Outer Sheath: Jackets are typically HDPE, PE, or LSZH/HFFR, providing UV resistance, flame retardance, and low smoke emission for safety in both outdoor and indoor installations (Corning, Olabs, Prysmian).

Color Coding: Fibers and buffer tubes are color-coded according to Telcordia-Bellcore standards for easy identification during installation and maintenance (Corning).

Fiber counts typically range from 2 to 24 fibers, with multi-tube designs supporting higher counts for campus or intercity backbones (Olabs, Premiumline).
