Fiber Optic Cable Components and Color Coding

- Outer Jacket Color (Fiber Type Identification)**
The outer jacket color indicates the fiber type and mode:
 - Yellow: Single-mode fiber (OS1/OS2)
 - Orange: Multimode fiber (OM1/OM2)
 - Aqua: Laser-optimized multimode fiber (OM3/OM4)
 - Emerald Green: OM5 wideband multimode fiberThese colors allow technicians to quickly identify the cable type in the field.
- Inner Fiber Color Sequence (Individual Fiber Identification)**
Inside multi-fiber cables, each fiber is color-coded in a 12-color repeating sequence: Blue, Orange, Green, Brown, Slate, White, Red, Black, Yellow, Violet, Rose, Aqua. For cables exceeding 12 fibers, the sequence repeats with striping or tube-based identification. For example, Fiber #34 is the 10th fiber in the 3rd buffer tube (Violet fiber in Green tube).
- Buffer Tube Color Coding (High-Count Cables)**
High-count cables (e.g., 48, 96, 144 fibers) use a tube and fiber system: Each buffer tube is assigned a color from the 12-color sequence. Fibers inside the tube follow the same 12-color sequence. This system ensures unique identification for every fiber in large cables.
- Connector and Boot Colors**
Connector colors indicate fiber mode and polish type:
 - Blue: UPC (Ultra Physical Contact) single-mode
 - Green: APC (Angled Physical Contact) single-mode
 - Beige: Multimode UPC
 - Aqua: Multimode laser-optimizedBoot colors help technicians quickly identify the connector type during installation and maintenance.
- Labeling and Documentation**
According to TIA-606-B, each cable should include:
 - Cable ID
 - Routing path
 - Installation date
 - Fiber numbers or legendsDurable, weather-resistant labels are recommended for both indoor and outdoor installations.
