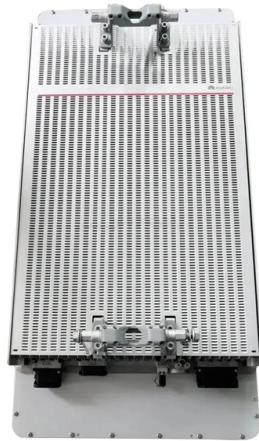

This model divides the network into three functional layers: the Access Layer, the Distribution Layer, and the Core Layer.
