

The laying of butterfly-shaped optical cables should be done in accordance with the following principles

Cable Structure and Types

Installation Guidelines

- Orientation and Routing** Always route the cable in its natural flat plane along walls, ceilings, or conduits to minimize stress on the fibers. Avoid bending the cable edge-on, which requires more force and can damage the fiber.
- Indoor vs. Outdoor Deployment**
 - Indoor cables (GJXH type):** FRP strength members, LSZH sheath, flexible for building entry to ONT, fiber counts from 1-12 cores.
 - Outdoor self-supporting cables (GJYXFCH/GJXFH type):** Add steel messenger wire, PE or dual-layer LSZH/PE jacket for UV and moisture resistance, suitable for aerial spans up to 50 meters.Transitioning from outdoor to indoor should involve either a dual-rated cable or a splice at the wall entry point to maintain compliance with fire and building codes.
- Splicing and Connection** Fusion splicing is preferred for permanent, low-loss connections; fibers are stripped, aligned, and fused using a high-voltage arc.
