Offline / Standby UPS: Provides basic surge protection and switches to battery power only when a power failure is detected. It is suitable for personal computers and small office equipment.

Line-Interactive UPS: Offers voltage regulation and surge protection while switching to battery during power interruptions. It is commonly used for small to medium-sized servers and network devices.

Online / Double Conversion UPS:

Continuously converts incoming AC power to DC and back to AC, providing constant, clean power with no transfer time. This type is ideal for critical systems like data ce...
